

## **ASAPH Building Projects 2012**

Ministry requires a location. In 2012, ASAPH Teaching Ministry began preparing a site where Andy Stump will minister to rural Haitians in the community where he has already worked for 20 years.

Step One was a storage shed that would serve as a launching pad for three larger buildings. It was completed in April. Step Two was a 16' x 16' cement room that will be the secure office and bedroom. It was completed in June. Step Three was a 16' x 16' steel building that will serve as living room/kitchen/dining room. building was purchased back in January, and the cement pad where it will stand was completed in July. Step Four is the ASAPH Teaching Center - - the hub of Andy's ministry. That 16' x 32' steel building was purchased in January, and the cement pad where it will stand was completed in August. What remains now is the arrival of the steel buildings and the erection of those buildings!


#### **Recent Lessons**

### Teaching Corner: Who was Asaph?

Asaph was a Levite and musician appointed during the time of King David to be a worship leader. His ministry apparently began on the dramatic occasion of the ark's arrival in Jerusalem (1 Chronicles 15,16). During those services, this phrase appears: "O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His mercy and loving-kindness endure forever!" The same phrase continues to appear throughout the period of the kings as well as in the psalms.

Asaph apparently formed a school or guild of musicians who carried on the ministry for several generations.

When Solomon finished construction of the temple, 'those of Asaph' were there to lead worship. "...they lifted up their voices with the trumpets and cymbals and other instruments for song and praised the Lord, saying, For He is good, for His mercy and loving-kindness endure forever..." (2 Chronicles 5:13). Generations later some of Asaph's family members, all singers, came back from Babylon and took part when the foundations of Zerubbabel's temple were laid (Ezra).

Psalm's #50, #73-#83 are attributed to Asaph in their titles. It's not clear whether it was Asaph who wrote

all 12 of the psalms or perhaps members of his guild.

In Psalm 50, the author speaks with the voice of God declaring that animal sacrifices are not what pleases Him. "...Every beast is mine...If I were hungry, I would not tell you...Do I eat flesh?" What does please God is declared in verse 14. "Offer to God the sacrifice of thanksgiving, and pay your vows to the Most High." Two elements in worship...thanksgiving and obedience. It is how we should live our lives...full of thanksgiving to God and obedience to God.
