Greetings from sunny Haiti. Haiti is in a mess. No one wants to see another leader gifted all the levers of power in Haiti by some group of people sitting around a table in a foreign country. It always ends up being the same thing. At the same time, Haiti is nowhere close to being able to vote for leadership. Gangs are emboldened by successfully removing a Prime Minister. Will they relinquish the power they have enjoyed for years now? Hardly. There seems to be no path forward.

Many have written to me expressing concern. I assure you we are doing fine. There is NO violence of any kind anywhere close to us. The countryside remains calm and "normal". We are able to do almost all of our ministry activities. With so little infrastructure, Port-au-Prince is pretty much a foreign country to those in rural Haiti.

I cherish the occasion to be here with these people living life every day. Jesus gave us that example. He came and pitched His tent among us. I happily pitch my tent here. It's what missionaries do.



OFFICE: When I arrived back in Haiti in February, our first job was to install some shelving and organize the brand new ASAPH office space. You may remember we cut my 16' x 16' cement room into two sides with a plywood wall. One side of the space remains a bedroom, the other side is now the official ASAPH administrative work space. It's tiny, but we are loving it.







Individual items related to maintenance, training, office work, and first aid now have a permanent place. Our money system is secure and organized. We are keeping records much better than before. *WEC* (Assistant Administrator) and *Shelterline* (Administrative Secretary) also have a place to sit and work now, and we can receive a visitor or two.:)



CALENDAR: For 2024, ASAPH has a calendar of ministry. Each month, a different branch of the ministry becomes the focus. It has been a fruitful scheme already. In January, the **English Club** hosted a program that Andy "attended" virtually from Pennsylvania. In February, the **Music Academy** teachers prepared a concert with their students on March 1st. March is set aside for **AVJF** (the girl's choir), and they will spend the month preparing for an Easter Day concert. The **ASAPH Leadership Team** will receive special attention in April. May is agriculture month (National Agriculture Day is May 1st) in Haiti, so **Asaph Agriculture** will prepare special activities for that month. (June is a "pause" month because students are taking final exams.)

In July, we celebrate the anniversary of ASAPH Teaching ministry. July 17th will mark 12 years of ministry! August is for AAF (soccer), and September is for the Asaph Brass Band. October is set aside for the Bible Academy, and November is the month where we'll try to focus on our new Academic Programs. December remains open (exams and Christmas).
